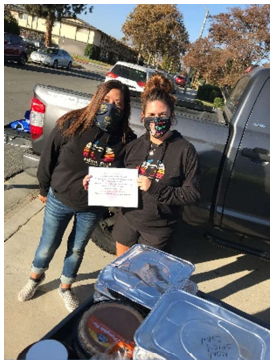

Club Woman, Kathy Clark

I joined the West Covina Women's Club as I knew some of the members and they were great leaders that gave so much of themselves to the community, so I wanted to be part. I grew up in ELA. My father was the bass fiddle player in the Desi Arnaz Band on the I Love Lucy Show. My grandparents had a 200-member family circus called Escalante Brothers Circus from the late 1800's to 1924. It broke up during the depression. My grandmother, a very pretty woman, was a singer and actress, used to walk me to the Catholic school I attended. I remember her in her big hat and hoop earrings and I was embarrassed because the other kids' mothers and grandmothers were very plain in dress. As I got older, I understood her and learned to try and look nice all the time. At 14 I convinced my father to let me go to public school as I had been sheltered at the Catholic school. Big mistake, I hung around with the wrong crowd, got married at 14 and had my twin sons at 15. However, my father always instilled in me that I could be anything I wanted to. At 17 I went back to school, graduated with my degree, worked as a legal secretary at the Public Defender's Office for 10 years and for 25 years was the corporate secretary of Victory Outreach International, and one of the pioneer's, where I developed the real estate, administration and corporate departments before I retired from there.

Currently I am the Treasurer of the Historical Society of West Covina, Corporate Secretary of the Tennant Foundation, Corporate Secretary of the Greater West Covina Business Association, member of the amazing West Covina Women's Club and West Covina Republican Women's Club. My "hobby" is my passion to help in the rehabilitation homes for persons with substance abuse addictions, gang violence and At Risk Youth. I have been involved and doing this for 50 years. I have lived in West Covina for 21 years. My daughters and I have a Real Estate Team - Clark Real Estate Group. I also offer free Notary services to all members of the West Covina Women's Club.

I was asked what I would like to see the WCWC do? This group does everything! They lead, teach, organize, inspire and support local groups with their needs. This incredible club has some of the best movers and shakers in the community. I am very proud to be a member.

COOKING CORNER – HOMEMADE EGG NOG

The BEST Homemade Egg Nog recipe! Thick and creamy with the perfect mild flavor and hint of nutmeg. You'll never buy store-bought eggnog again!

Prep Time15 mins **Cook Time**10 mins **Total Time**25 mins **Servings:** 6

Ingredients

- 6 large egg yolks
- 1/2 cup granulated sugar
- 1 cup heavy whipping cream
- 2 cups milk
- 1/2 teaspoon ground nutmeg
- pinch of salt
- 1/4 teaspoon vanilla extract
- ground cinnamon, for topping

Instructions

- Whisk the egg yolks and sugar together in a medium bowl until light and creamy.
- In a saucepan over medium-high heat, combine the cream, milk, nutmeg and salt. Stir often until mixture reaches a bare simmer.
- Add a big spoonful of the hot milk to the egg mixture, whisking vigorously. Repeat, adding a big spoonful at a time, to temper the eggs.
- Once most of the hot milk has been added to the eggs, pour the mixture back into the saucepan on the stove.
- Whisk constantly for just a few minutes, until the mixture is just slightly thickened (or until it reaches about 160 degrees F on a thermometer). It will thicken more as it cools.
- Remove from heat and stir in the vanilla.
- Pour the eggnog into a pitcher or other container and cover with plastic wrap.
- Refrigerate until chilled. It will thicken as it cools. If you want a thinner, completely smooth consistency, you can add the entire mixture to a blender with 1 or 2 tablespoons of milk and blend until smooth.
- Serve with a sprinkle of cinnamon, and fresh whipped cream, if desired.
- Store homemade eggnog in the fridge for up to one week.
