## **The Woman's Club of West Covina November 6, 2020 Meeting Minutes**

President Nancy Anzalone called the virtual meeting of Friday, November 6, 2020 of The Woman's Club of West Covina to order at 11:00 a.m. and thanked Past President Luanne Arredondo for her continued assistance in getting members online to join in. Inspirational Chair, Carole Mullner read an inspiring story about a father's love for his daughter and then led us in the Pledge of Allegiance.

The October minutes were approved as printed in the Link. Correspondence Secretary, Sue Kreger stated no correspondence had been received.

George Ogden, 3<sup>rd</sup> V.P. Membership recommended that members could give the gift of membership to a friend or relative as a way of increasing our membership goal. He didn't immediately know the current number of members on roll nor of those who were delinquent but would find out and report at next meeting. He also advised that member, Carrie Maldonado's family had moved her to Claremont and as soon as he could obtain the information would advise of her address, etc.

President Nancy reminded all about the See's Candy fundraiser and requested anyone interested in placing an order should contact her directly at (626) 339-0874 as soon as possible. Order blanks were included in the November Link. Additionally, as Valerie Gerlach, Club Dean had an emergency doctor's appointment, she had been excused but did state that the San Gabriel Valley District had cancelled its Fall Council.

Craft Chairman, Marge Cokely reported that the Craft Section had made thus far a total of 537 masks of which (150 for adults and 60 for teenagers and children) had been delivered to WINGS, \$260 In Kind Donations and the group had logged in 269 hours.

President Nancy reported that on October 30<sup>th</sup>, at 10:00 a.m. two sheet cakes and a thank you plaque was presented to the West Covina Police Department from the Club as our appreciation for services rendered to the community. Those in attendance were George Ogden (took photos) Nancy Anzalone, Nanci Sachs, Liz Mullender and me, Sandra Taylor. Then later that afternoon at 4:30 p.m. she, Luanne Arredondo, her Son Brian, Amelia Iniguez and again myself handed out over 211 treat bags of goodies at the West Covina Mall during its drive through Halloween celebration.

Liz Mullender, 4<sup>th</sup> V.P. Programs, also excused, but presented via telephone, the Club's Guest Speaker, Jenica Morin Pascual of WINGS, a domestic violence shelter. First, she thanked the Club for the face masks which are given to new families upon their arrival. They, too, are trying to adjust to the "new normal". They provide guests with a 45-day emergency stay to keep safe. The ratio is usually 1 out of every 2 women and 1 out of every 4 men with staff manning the Help Lines 24 hours a day. Currently they have been receiving more teenagers and consequently are in need of hairbrushes, lotion, towels and gift cards for fast food restaurants, Target, Walmart and expressed her appreciation for the partnership with our Club. President Nancy thanked her for her report and advised that the Club will continue its support and will supply Thanksgiving dinner to all residents and staff by donating a check for \$150.

Member Edwina Clark extended an invitation to attend a Remembrance Day services for veterans at her Church, Holy Trinity Episcopalian located at 3<sup>rd</sup> and Badillo in the City of Covina, Sunday, November 8<sup>th</sup> at 4:00 p.m. President Nancy thanked everyone for having joined in and stated our next meeting, December 4<sup>th</sup>, still virtual, will consist of a musical program.

Past President Patti Pierce was asked to lead us in our closing song, “Let There Be Peace”, but rather than to do that because of so much static and other interference, she read it in poetic form. The virtual meeting was adjourned at 11:41 a.m.
